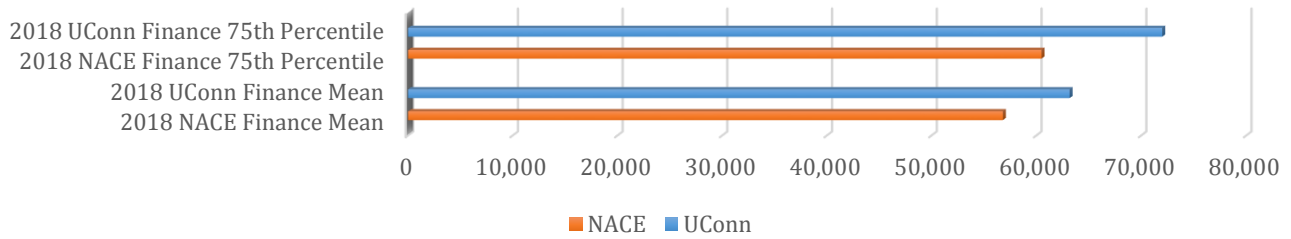

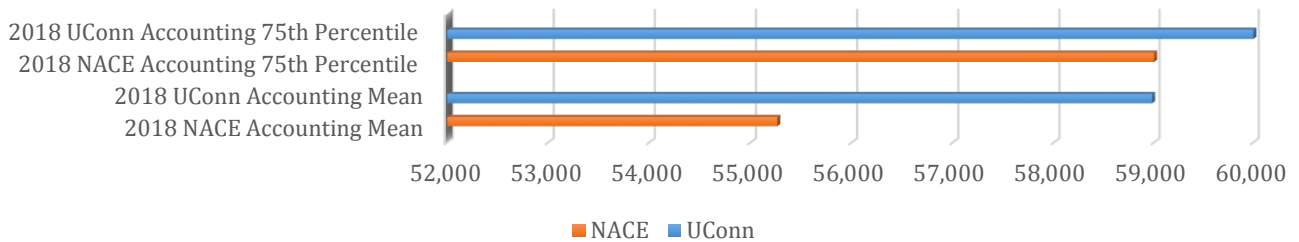

SAMPLE OF BUSINESS MAJORS BY SALARY

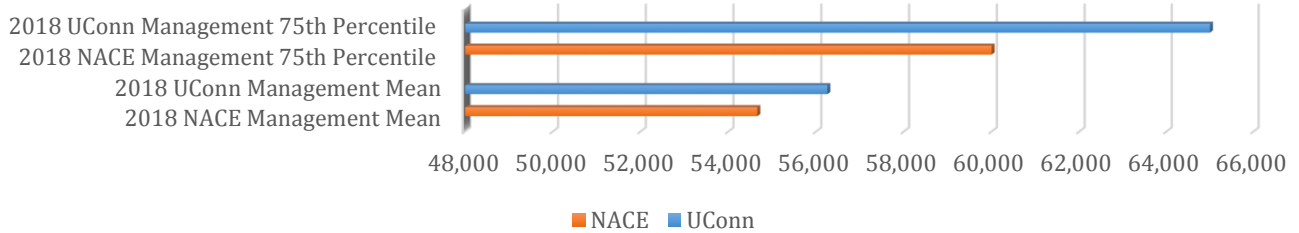
UConn Finance Salary Vs. NACE Finance Salary



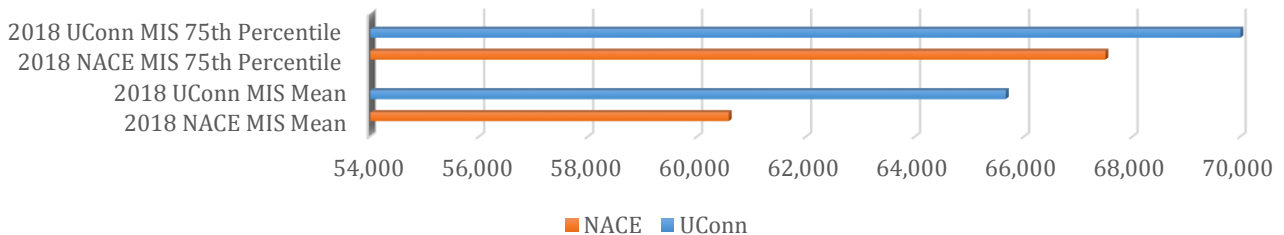
UConn Accounting Salary Vs. NACE Accounting Salary
