- Are you a good fit? "We invest in **bold** people and transformative ideas in the fields of exploration, scientific research, storytelling, and education. We further global understanding and support educators to ensure that the next generation is armed with geographic knowledge and global awareness. We create a community of change, advancing key insights about our planet and probing some of the most pressing scientific questions of our time."
 - Per their website, "We are looking for bold people who share our **passion for exploration, storytelling, science, and education** and who want to help spread our mission. If this sounds like you, we encourage you to explore our open positions." Don't be afraid to stretch outside of your comfort zone and be bold!
- Goal for internship program is "to provide **engaging**, **educational**, **and work-related opportunities** for both undergraduate and graduate students"
- National Geographic allows employees paid time off to volunteer in their communities
- Interns are eligible to accrue sick days, participate in National Geographic's 401(k) program, receive discounts at their Museum and Store, and free membership to their gym
- Throughout the program, you will receive **support and guidance** from a wide array of National Geographic staff as you explore what it is like to help achieve their mission to illuminate and protect the wonder of our world.
- To be eligible for an internship, you must be a **rising Sophomore or above**
- Internship opportunities are posted in **mid-January**, plan ahead!
